

Working Wood 1 & 2: The Artisan Course With Paul Sellers



Synopsis

This book is the core part of a course that represents the distilled experience and knowledge, developed over 47 years, of Woodworker and Master Craftsman, Paul Sellers. His remarkable journey saw him learn his trade as a traditional apprentice in England during in the 1960s, and then progress, many years later, to design and make furniture for American Presidents. Evident throughout this beautifully crafted book is Paul's love of woodworking and also of teaching. It is a source of inspiration as well as a complete woodworking system and philosophy. The clarity of Paul's teaching is quite exceptional. Founded on twenty years experience during which he has taught over 3,000 woodworkers, the book progressively introduces new skills and techniques through projects, and then reinforces and expands on these as the reader progresses further. With over 800 color photos, diagrams and illustrations, every stage and technique is clearly explained and discussed. Working Wood is a comprehensive course in hand tool woodworking. It is perfect for beginners just starting out and is also a valuable resource for the more advanced woodworker, helping them to further develop their hand tool skills and woodworking knowledge. The first part of the book will enable you to discover the simple concepts that surround the use of traditional hand tools and master aspects of woodworking in general. It introduces the mantra of "sharpness, accuracy, technique" By using only three joints and about ten hand tools, you will be introduced to the speed and efficiency of hand cut joinery. What can be said of Paul Sellers and his body of work that hasn't already been stated. He is a true, old school craftsman who has the ability to mentor through his written works and videos. This is a great book that may seem a bit simplistic at first, but is put together in a detailed manner that leaves no room for guesswork on the part of the reader. The only issue I have is the title. When someone asks me what I'm reading, I have to explain that it's about making things out of wood before I show them the cover with its blazing title, "Working Wood."

I have been involved in hand tool woodworking about 35 years; more during the last five years since retirement. Over the years I have purchased about every book written on this subject. This is my most resent purchase. It is also the best I have seen. If you are just starting out with hand tools, buy this book. If you have been using hand tools for years, buy this book. You will unlearn some old bad habits and learn a bunch of new better ways of doing things. If I had purchased it when it first came out my wood working ability would be more advanced I would probably have more to show for my money.I have gained so much from watching Paul on You Tube. I started to feel guilty learning so

much for free so I bought this book. I have his new book on my Christmas wish list, Hope Santa doesn't let me down. Paul is truly a master woodworker and much more. He is truly an Artisan, In my humble opinion we can all learn a great deal from him.

Sellars has a great insight and desire to teach woodworking from the ground up [if you'll permit that statement]. He is a hand tool artisan, not a hand tool fanatic. He explains the basic tool complement and how to use the tools to create simple projects to learn concepts. A good read whether you are a beginner or more experienced with hand or power tools. Recommended reading for everyone.

If you have ever thought of getting in to hand tool woodworking, I highly recommend this book. Beginning projects assume you have 0 woodworking experience. Each project teaches a skill that is built upon with each project until you are eventually making wooden furniture with hand tools.

I am a beginner woodworker and I can't say enough good things about this book. It starts in shop-class in their schools and it is all over the internet. Power tools are deemed efficient and fast, hand tools are deemed dull and unusable. In reality, hand tools produce better results in the hands of an experienced woodworker. Hand tools do not require the large initial investment of money and space that power tools require. Paul Sellers' book is a fantastic resource in understanding how to use basic inexpensive hand tools, sharpen them, set them correctly, and start doing projects. His book describes three beautiful projects (a shaker end table, a wall shelf, and a dovetail candle box). He then goes into building a workbench out of 2x4s with mortise-tenon joinery. The top is made of laminated 2x4s and is very sturdy (I am making one). Finally, he goes into sharpening tools...chisels, hand planes, and even saws. The daunting and somewhat mystic world of hand tools woodworking is completely demystified in this book. All my questions were answered. After reading this book (and watching Paul's videos on youtube), I felt confident in tackling my woodworking projects. I highly recommend this book.

Great presentation of basic skills and technique, however it is more suited for the coffee table than the workshop. Probably the most visual and dynamic presentation of these skills out there. I understand Mr. Sellers was disappointed in it. Probably a generational thing. I'll continue though to obtain whatever Mr. Sellers puts out, as I feel he is the best woodworking crafts person out there. I'm so glad he is so sharing of his knowledge.
