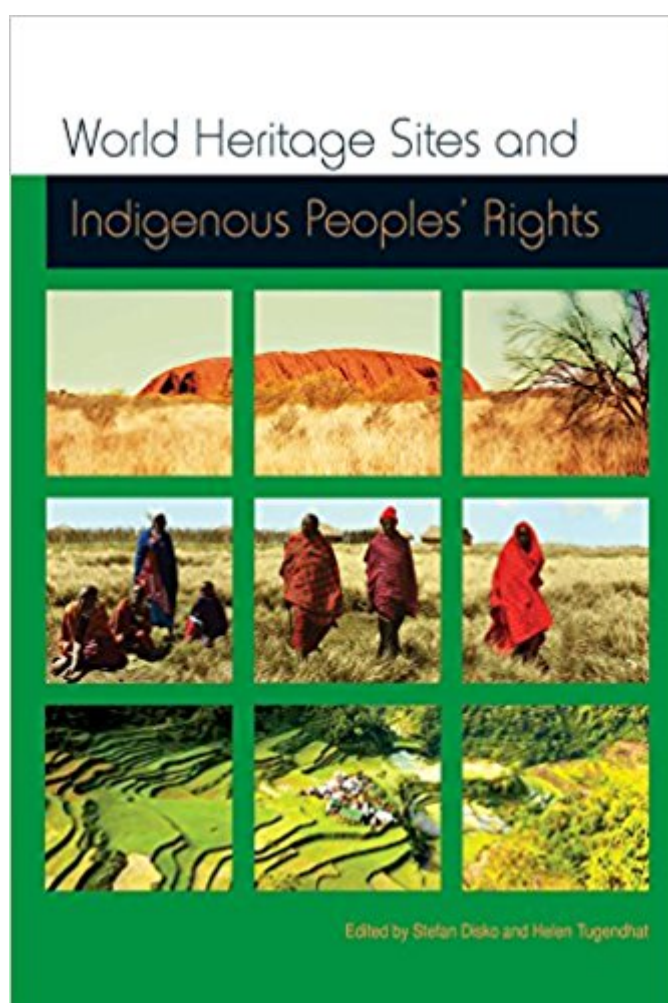


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World Heritage Sites And Indigenous Peoples Rights: IWGIA Document No. 129 (Iwgia Documents)
