

Dated. Of course, many of the facts are perfectly valid--but the style (though graceful in its way) will be off-putting for some modern readers. Also, it's 'old-school' in its approach to history--much of the text is purely concerned with the power politics and military history, with nothing about how people lived, or why the monotonous roll of conquests might have mattered. That said, you do end up with a 'big picture' view of the late Byzantine Empire, which was what I was looking for. So, for \$0.99, 'that works.'

Bury strikes a clear cord for the restoration of the knowledge of that 1100 years reign of the so-called Byzantine Empire. While the West wallowed in centuries of near universal ignorance, the Empire centered in Constantinople, shone through like a light in the darkness. That light could not be extinguished even by the darkness of Islamic conquest, and continues to enlighten the world through its spiritual descendants.
