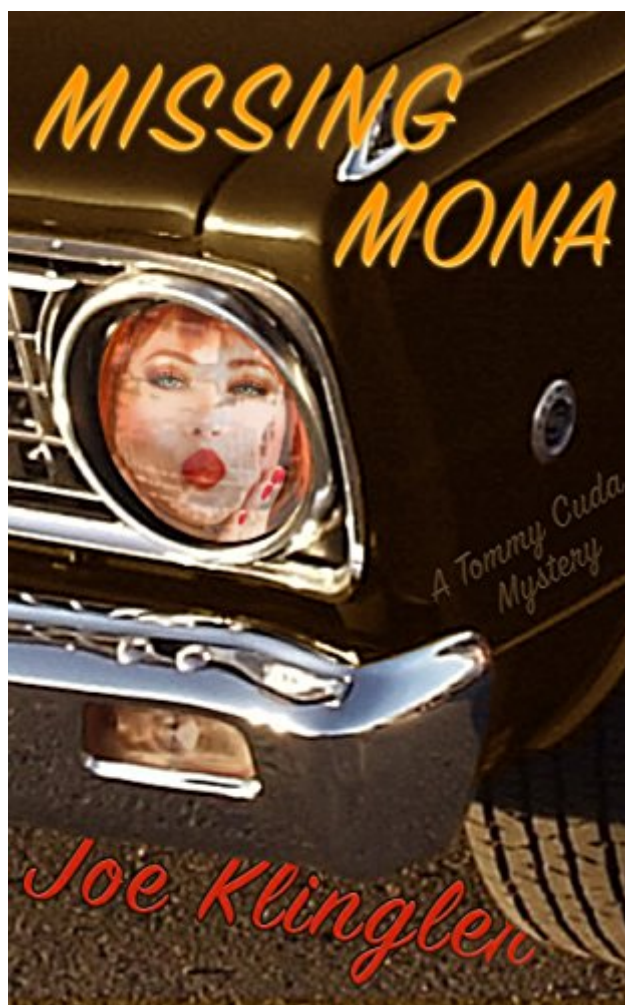

Initially, I thought this was just going to be another trashy detective type novel. Not particularly impressed with the writing or characters (seemed filled with cliches), BUT, I was very pleasantly surprised as I got into the story. Maybe not great literature, but an easy style to read, interesting characters and all in all, an enjoyable ride.

Missing Mona was an absolutely fun read, especially if you like mysteries from the classic noir genre. Tommy, the primary character, is a smart, friendly, respectable guy in a dead-end job, who decides to head west (from Ohio) to find himself. He gets himself into a bit of trouble by telling a beautiful hitchhiker that he is a private investigator - (what beautiful woman is going to think a car mechanic working at Walmart is cool?). Things appear to be going his way when they settle into a swanky hotel in Chicago, however things begin to go haywire when she is missing the next morning and he's tasked with finding her. He immediately needs to learn to operate in the windy city, make some friends, stay out of trouble with the law, avoid the bad guys and of course find Mona. I loved the characters in Missing Mona, they were real and had intelligent dialog. The plot was well thought-out, exciting and riveting with lots of twists right til the end. I recommend Missing Mona to anyone, especially if you're looking to get away for an exciting summertime visit to Chicago.

Missing MonaJoe Klingler's latest novel begins with a departure from the world of hi-tech with the protagonist, being a just turned thirty, college graduate and car mechanic at Wal-Mart, tossing his cell phone out the window of his restored Hemi Barracuda as he heads west on I-80 to see the Pacific Ocean. He picks up a beautiful hitchhiker along the way named Mona. After an evening at the W in Chicago he awakens to find her missing with a note, "Find Me". This begins a wild ride with Tommy Cuda desperately search for Mona. Along the way, in less that a week, he meets six beautiful women all of whom want to be with him. (Makes me want to move back to Chicago) As he searches, he is drawn deeper and deeper into the hi-tech world of surveillance, encryption, and undercover disguises and the dark world of murder, theft, counterfeit money and deception.
