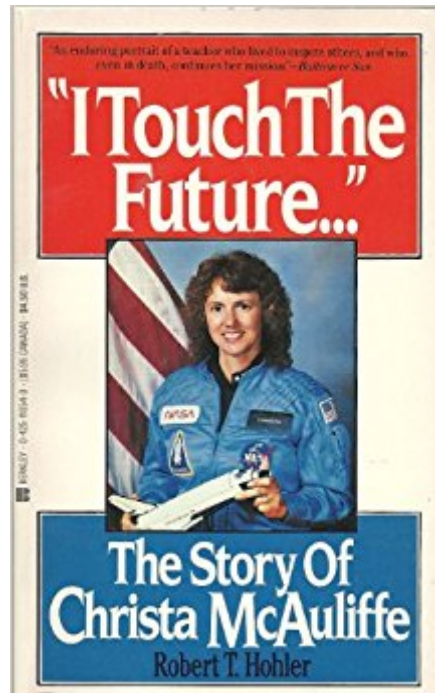

The book almost literally puts you in Christa's back pocket from the time she overheard President Reagan's speech on the radio that he wanted to put a teacher in space, to the time we all gasped in horror and disbelief as we watched on television what we never thought would or might happen. It was written by a journalist from Harford, CT where Christa was from, and who followed her and interviewed her during her months of training for the Challenger mission she would never complete. I highly recommend this book for anyone interested in knowing more about the extraordinary and genuine person that was Christa McAuliffe, as well as more about the Challenger tragedy that you may not know.
