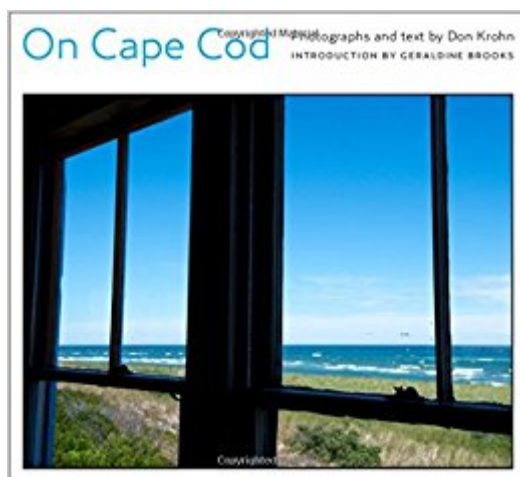

With each of the Cape's fifteen towns represented in this series of over 100 color photographs, Cape-lovers will surely discover something new, along with the familiar, while strangers will quickly find themselves converts, fiending for a visit to this varied and scenic peninsula. Very loosely chronicling the arc of a summer day, the illustrations - ranging from formal nature studies to breezy journalistic images - offer a rich visual immersion into a Cape Cod idyll. Krohn's introduction highlights the personal connection that flourishes when one takes the time to truly explore one's surroundings. Ranging in tone from carefree to serious, ethereal to everlasting, like the region he captures in his photographs, it exists as the perfect complement to the diverse array of images presented in this edition.

Don Krohn is a New York City-born photographer and occasional writer, teacher, and designer. In the South of France, his previous book of photographs, was highly acclaimed. A graduate of Brandeis University and Harvard Law School, he also pursued studies at the University of Chicago's Committee on Social Thought. He was founder and first president of both the esteemed Cape Cod Lighthouse Charter School and the Orleans Improvement Association, and drafted Orleans' innovative architectural review bylaw. His civic activities continue with involvement in the Orleans Community Partnership and the Orleans Cultural District. As a photographer he is self-taught in many variations of the medium, and travels extensively in pursuit of his craft. He and his wife Janis Brennan are co-owners of Main Street Books and the Orleans Whole Food Store.

Being born and raised here and never living elsewhere one would think I would have seen all the nooks and crannies of the Cape. But after roaming through Don Krohn's *On Cape Cod* I found myself seeing my beloved Cape with new eyes. The book is a beautiful addition to our large collection of photographic books. Having lived on the Cape on and off over six decades, I found this book a great balm for times when I can't be there. Krohn has captured so many of those moments - from the statue-still heron at the edge of a marsh to the slide to base of a Cape Cod Redbird - that I had imagined could never be captured. His is a rare gift. Aside from the photographs, which would be enough of a treat, Krohn chronicles some of the amazing places he's explored or spent time in, like the famous dune shacks.

His description of weathering a hurricane in one of them brings to life a timeless Cape Cod experience. Krohn thoughtfully weaves together his own observations enhanced by the breadth and depth of his reading in a variety of fields. Buy it - you won't regret it!
