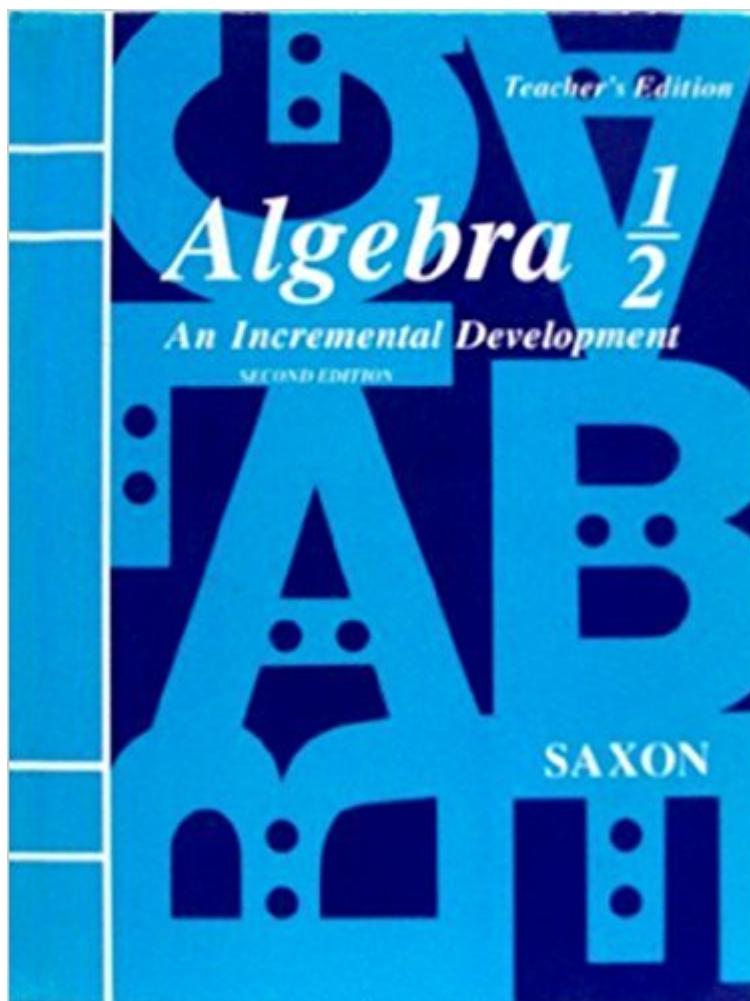

Saxon is a good, solid curriculum, although the sole use of Saxon as a math curriculum might handicap a student once they encountered a school system using a different math curriculum. I have seen several students who have always excelled in advanced math who used Saxon almost exclusively, and they then hit college math. The difference in mathematical approaches have caused previously excellent math students both to struggle to understand the new curriculum, and to keep up their grades. But, I have found Saxon useful to use with a lower level student who requires frequent review of both math facts and the basic principles they are currently learning. I love Singapore math, but the lack of frequent review in the texts led me to enroll my child in a class using Saxon. My child chafes at the long, seemingly repetitive exercises, but I attempt to reassure him that Saxon will make math easy again. And maybe fun, too. But Saxon itself definitely isn't fun. It's like medicine; bitter to take, but it makes you much better. And Saxon is very good at making you much better. At math.

We just switched from A Beka math to Saxon pre-algebra and I wish that I had made that change much sooner. While A Beka teaches steps, procedures and formulas but spends little time on conceptual understanding, the Saxon method is the opposite. There are diagrams to help reinforce understanding of the concepts being taught. I like how the subjects change daily but continue to show up again and again in review. This keeps things fresh and interesting, rather than driving any single subject into the ground and then leaving it. We will continue with Saxon for the rest of high school math.
